The girls were able to use this experience to help them to complete their performing arts course. We all had a wonderful time!




DSTC ECO PROJECT

MOULIN ROUGE WORKSHOP WITH JONATHAN MAWSON



"RISE UP ACADEMY" AT DSTC

During the penultimate week of term, we were honoured to host the "Rise Up Academy" for 5 days of Media and Broadcasting workshops. "Rise Up Academy" is an outreach programme delivering broadcast engineering and technical workshops to primary and secondary school children aged 9 through to 18 years old. Its intention is to inspire, educate and inform children and young adults about the pathways and career opportunities available to them within the broadcast technology industry.

DSTC was able to coordinate and run workshops with "Rise Up" for over 200 students over the week, with 60 of those being Year 5 and 6 students from Westgate Primary school. The media industry is currently facing a major skills shortage, so empowering young people with this opportunity is incredibly important to us.











Each workshop involved a briefing and lesson about moving images and how TV is broadcast. The students learnt about all the technology involved in a TV screen and how an image is made up of pixels.

The main part of each workshop was to assemble, cable and use a mobile TV studio. Students had access to state of the art equipment, used by media professionals worldwide. The kit was the same type and specification as the professionals used in their day jobs. Both DSTC and Westgate Primary students used the equipment to an incredibly high standard, building each section of the studio themselves.

Once the studio was built, all the students were able to rotate around each section of the equipment and take turns in using it. This ranged from operating cameras and monitoring to live sound and of course taking part in the show itself.




















WORK EXPERIENCE 2022


At the end of the Summer term, students in Years 10 and 12 took part in work experience. This was a fantastic opportunity for our students to gain employability skills and continue their personal development.

For the first time since 2019, students were able to take part in physical work experience placements, as well as taking advantage of the many virtual work experiences (VWEX) on offer.

Students secured physical placements in a wide variety of industries, including: finance, hospitality, auto-mechanics, healthcare, Police, performing arts, logistics, education, office, retail, beauty and animal care.

In addition, VWEX placements were completed in Psychology, Film and Media, Law, Accounting, Technology, Medicine and Dentistry.

Students showed their resilience by attending placements despite the unprecedented heatwave. Other students' adaptability was evident when their placements changed to hybrid working, so students did not have to travel.









Here is what some of our students had to say about their experiences:

"I really enjoyed my work experience (at **Canopy by Hilton**). I have always been very interested in finance so when I chose my work experience I was really excited about it. My work experience helped me realise this was something I wanted to do in the future, as the skills I picked up and the things I learnt were useful. I found the work experience fun and exciting and the people at my placement to be nice and helpful. This really encouraged me to pursue this in the future." **ML Year 12**

"From my Virtual (online) Work Experience (VWEX) I enjoyed learning about a subject I have never learned about before which was psychology, using Springpod. Attending live seminars taught me a sense of responsibility and organisation. I gained more confidence in asking questions as you can ask any question you want about the topic! Moreover, I learnt time management skills as you have to plan out when in the day to do you work experience as you're doing it online – flexibility is also a key aspect of online work experience as you might have certain things planned at a time a seminar is on and have to work around that. Overall it was a really great experience and there are so many courses you can take, there are topics for every interest, I definitely recommend it." EB Year 10

"For my work experience I took part with the **Police**, and I have to say it was one of the most interesting, eye opening experiences I have ever been able to be involved in. One of my key highlights involves being able to go on the runway at Heathrow airport with the armed officers. 
